

Subject to provisions of certain act.

Capital stock.

Commencement and completion of road.

Hill and Springhouse turnpike, at or near Flourtown; subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto.

SECTION 2. The capital stock of the said company shall consist of six hundred shares, at twenty-five dollars each: *Provided*, Said company may, by a vote of the stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock, if it shall be deemed necessary to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act.

SECTION 3. That if said company shall not commence the construction of their road within two years, and complete the same within five years after the passage of this act, it shall be null and void, except so far as it is necessary to settle up the affairs and pay the debts of the company.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act incorporating the Catawissa, Williamsport and Erie railroad company; relative to the Bloomsburg railroad and iron company; to deeds and titles to lots in the town of M'Keesport; and repealing the first section of an act passed in eighteen hundred and forty four, in relation to certain state roads.

Catawissa, Williamsport and Erie railroad company authorized to extend their road.
Bloomsburg railroad and iron company authorized to subscribe, &c.

First section of certain act relative to the Pittsburgh and Steubenville turnpike road, repealed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for the said company to construct and extend their railroad, under the provisions of their charter, to the borough of Danville, in the county of Columbia.

SECTION 2. That the president of the Bloomsburg railroad and iron company is hereby authorized to subscribe to the stock of the Catawissa, Williamsport and Erie railroad company, to an amount which shall not exceed one eighth of the stock of said company.

SECTION 3. That the first section of an act supplementary to an act authorizing the laying out of certain state roads, and for other purposes, passed the tenth day April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight; and a supplement to an act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Little Conemaugh, at Johnstown, Cambria county, approved eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four; the supplementary act first named, ap-

proved the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. The titles to certain lots situated in the borough of M'Keesport, in the county of Allegheny, made by Nathaniel Holmes and John M. Snowden, as treasurers of the aforesaid county of Allegheny, on sales made in pursuance of the laws of this commonwealth, directing unseated lands or grounds to be sold for taxes assessed and unpaid, are hereby declared to be legal, valid and fully confirmed, to all intents and purposes; and that no informality or irregularity in the mode or manner of assessment of taxes made in the borough of M'Keesport as aforesaid, on the lots returned to the commissioners of Allegheny county, for the years one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, thirty-three, thirty-four and thirty-five, and sold by said commissioners in the years one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four and thirty-six, shall invalidate or render illegal any such sales; and the deeds made and executed in pursuance of said sales, shall be deemed and held to be legal and valid, as if no such informality or irregularity had occurred.

AN ACT

Authorizing the trustees of the Constitutional Presbyterian congregation of Donegal township, Westmoreland county, to sell and convey certain real estate; extending certain road laws to the counties of Westmoreland and Washington; incorporating the Greensburg, Sewickly and West Newton turnpike and plank road company; relative to Mifflin and Randolph streets and Lehigh avenue, in the county of Philadelphia; to the time of holding the borough elections in Adamstown; authorizing the school directors of the North-west ward of the city of Reading to borrow money; and the trustees of the Buffalo English congregation in Saville township, Perry county, to sell real estate.

WHEREAS, The Constitutional Presbyterian congregation, commonly known as the New School congregation of Donegal township, Westmoreland county, some years since erected a church or house of worship for the use and occupation of said congregation, in the township and county aforesaid, that there are debts for the erection of said house ye unpaid, and to which the said congregation are unable to pay, and that owing to the inability of said congregation to support a minister, and have no longer any use for said house as a house of worship; therefore,
