AN ACT

To authorize the governor to incorporate the Beaver Township plank road company, in the county of Crawford; and relative to the boroughs of Titusville and Conneautville, in said county; and to the claim of James T. Simonton.

Commissioners.	SECTION 1. <i>Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,</i> That L. Chapman, G. D. Gates, J. E. Patten, F. Manter, Calvin Gates, Scoter Griswold, William L. Hollenbeck be and they, or any three of them, are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company, by the name, style and title of
Style.	"The Beaver Township plank road company;" with power to construct a plank road, commencing at a point where Fisher's road crosses the Erie canal, near Conneautville, and running west through Beaver township, to the Ohio state line, all in the county of Crawford; subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved on the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplements thereto.
Location.	
Subject to provisions of certain act.	
Capital stock.	SECTION 2. The capital stock of said company shall consist of six hundred shares, of twenty-five dollars each: <i>Provided,</i> That said company may, from time to time, by a vote of the stockholders, at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock so much as may, in their opinion, be necessary to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act.
Double track.	SECTION 3. The road shall consist of a track of not less than eight, nor more than fourteen feet wide, with power to lay a double track, if the company shall see proper to do so, each eight feet wide.
Tolls.	SECTION 4. The said company shall have power to charge and collect such tolls as shall be deemed reasonable and necessary to the maintenance of said road.
Commencement and completion of road.	SECTION 5. That if said company shall not commence the construction of said road in three years, and complete the same within six years from the passage of this act, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may necessary to wind up and settle the affairs and pay the debts of the company.
Privileges of certain act extended to borough of Titusville and Conneautville.	SECTION 6. That the privileges and provisions of the act, entitled "An Act to authorize the erection of a lock-up house in the borough of Birmingham, in the county of Allegheny, and to collect certain taxes therein," approved the eighth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, be and the same are hereby extended to the borough of Titusville, and also to the borough of Conneautville, in the county of Crawford.
Election of councilmen in the borough of Titusville.	SECTION 7. That at the election to be held on the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the borough of Titusville, two members of the town council of said borough shall be elected for one year, and two members for two years; and two members of the council for said borough shall be elected annually, on the third Friday of March, to serve two years.

SECTION 8. That at the election to be held on the third Friday of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, it shall be lawful for the citizens of said borough to elect three auditors, one to serve one year, one to serve two years, and one to serve three years; and on the third Friday of March annually thereafter, to elect one auditor to serve three years. Auditors for said borough.

SECTION 9. That so much of the act incorporating the borough of Titusville, approved the thirteenth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, as is hereby altered, amended or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 10. That at the election to be held on the third Friday of one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the borough of Conneautville, two members of the town council of said borough shall be elected for one year, and two members for two years; and two members of the council for said borough shall be elected annually on the third Friday of March, to serve two years. Election of councilmen in the borough of Conneautville.

SECTION 11. That at the election to be held on the third Friday of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, it shall be lawful for the citizens of said borough to elect three auditors, one to serve one year, one to serve two years, and one to serve three years; and on the third Friday of March annually thereafter to elect one auditor to serve three years. Auditors.

SECTION 12. That so much of the act incorporating the borough of Conneautville, approved the thirteenth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, as is hereby altered, amended or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.

SECTION 13. That the name of John T. Simonton, where it occurs in the twenty-second section of an act, entitled "An Act to provide for the ordinary expenses of the government, the repairs of canals and railroads of the commonwealth, and the payment of other claims due by the same," approved the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, shall read James T. Simonton. Name of John T. Simonton, in the appropriation act of 1849, shall read James T. Simonton.
