AN ACT

To incorporate the Saint Paul's beneficial society of young men of the city and county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That John M'Gettigen, John P. M'Fadden, Patrick M'Galdrick, John A. Powell, James M'Minamin, John Hanley, John M'Minamin, James M'Connell, Bernard M'Geehan, Patrick A. Tinney, John Mass and their associates, be and they are hereby erected into a body corporate, by the name and style of "The Saint Paul's beneficial society of young men of the city and county of Philadelphia," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in all courts of record and elsewhere, to take, hold and purchase for the use of the said beneficial society, lands, goods, chattels, moneys of any kind whatever, by gift, grant, conveyance, devise or bequest from any person or persons capable of making the same, and the same to sell, convey, mortgage or dispose of for the use of the said society, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which may be lawful for them to do for the well being of the society, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof: *Provided*, That the estate shall in no case exceed the yearly value of three thousand dollars.

Privileges.

SECTION 2. The object of this association shall be to give assistance to the distressed, to relieve its members in case of sickness, to defray the expenses of their funerals, or such other cases of distress as shall be defined by the by laws.

Object.

SECTION 3. The officers of this society shall consist of a president, vice president, secretary and assistant secretary, treasurer, two stewards and a messenger, whose duties shall be prescribed by the by-laws.

Officers.

SECTION 4. The officers of this society shall be elected annually at a stated meeting, at such time and place as shall be provided by the by-laws.

Annual election.

SECTION 5. Each person on being admitted a member of this association, shall sign the constitution, and pay such entrance money and monthly and other dues and contributions as the society may by their by-laws from time to time resolve and declare.

Dues.

SECTION 6. A member may be expelled under such provisions as shall be stated in their by-laws.

Expelling of members.

SECTION 7. The duties and rights of the officers and members, the mode of supplying all vacancies, the time and place of meeting, the number required for a quorum, the terms of admission, the mode of electing members, and any other concerns of the society, shall be regulated by the by laws hereafter to be made.

Vacancies.

By-laws. SECTION 8. The corporation shall have power and authority to make by-laws conformable to this charter, and not in violation of the laws of the United States and of this commonwealth.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to erect the village of Oxford, in the county of Chester, into a borough," passed April eighth, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three; and relative to roads in the township of Birmingham, in Chester county; to Wager and Marsh streets, in Kensington, Philadelphia county; and relative to the borough of Hookstown, in Beaver county; and to the Robeson school house, in Manayunk, Philadelphia county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That

Annual election. from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for all persons residing in the borough of Oxford, entitled to vote for members of the legislature, who shall have resided in said borough six months next preceding to such election, to meet at the Oxford Borough hotel, in said borough, (or such other place as may be hereafter appointed,) on the third Friday in March, and thereafter on the same day annually, and then and there elect by ballot, between the hours of one and six o'clock of the same day, one reputable citizen residing therein, who shall be styled "The burgess of said borough," and six reputable citizens residing therein, who shall be a town council; and shall also elect as aforesaid, one reputable citizen as high constable, also two citizens of said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, one of whom shall be appointed constable of said borough; also at the first election, three

Constable.

School directors. school directors, one to serve one year, one for two years, and one for three years, and thereafter one school director annually; and the said citizens shall also at the same time and place, elect a judge and inspectors of election, and assessors, agreeably to the laws of this commonwealth, and annually thereafter; the said elections shall be conducted in the same manner as is provided for the election of township officers of this commonwealth, except that the certificates of the election of burgess and all other borough officers and school directors, shall be filed
