A SUPPLEMENT

To the act passed March twenty-third, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, incorporating the Columbia and Marietta turnpike road company ; relative to the collection of taxes in Lancaster county ; and for the sale of certain real estate in Columbia county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president and managers of the company aforesaid, by their agents appointed for that purpose, are hereby authorized to demand and receive from each and every person using the said turnpike in any way whatever, the same rates of toll as *was* allowed to be taken on the Columbia, Chiques and Marietta road and bridge company, for passing over the same. Tolls on the Columbia and Marietta turnpike road.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of the seventh section of the act, entitled "An Act authorizing the sale of certain real estate, and relative to the collection of taxes in certain townships in Monroe, Berks and Lancaster counties, and certain school districts in Butler, Franklin, Mifflin, Indiana and Schuylkill counties," passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, be extended to Strasburg township, Lancaster county. Provisions of 7th section of certain act relating to the collection of taxes extended to the borough of Strasburg, Lancaster county.

SECTION 3. That John Sharpless, of Catawissa, Columbia county, is hereby authorized to sell and convey a certain lot of ground situated in Franklin township, Columbia county, being the property of the late John P. Davis, deceased, which was not disposed of by his last will and testament: *Provided,* That a majority of the surviving heirs of the late John Davis, deceased, shall require the said John Sharpless so to do. John Sharpless authorized to sell certain real estate.
