A SUPPLEMENT

To an act to incorporate the Island, in Conemaugh township, Cambria county, into a borough, to be called Conemaugh; and authorizing the auditor general to examine the claims of Jonathan Large; to incorporate the Indiana and Cherry Tree plank road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the boundaries of the borough of Conemaugh, in the county of Cambria, be and they are hereby enlarged as follows, viz: beginning at the south-west corner of said borough; thence north forty degrees east sixty-four perches to a post; thence by a north-westerly course to the Conemaugh river; thence down the margin of the said river to where it strikes the line of the borough aforesaid; thence by the said borough line to the place of beginning, and the land included within the above mentioned limits is hereby made part and parcel of said borough, as fully as if it had been included in the act incorporating the same. Boundaries.

SECTION 2. That the borough of Conemaugh aforesaid, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the qualified electors thereof shall hold their general and borough elections at school house, No. 1, in said borough, and George W. Easley is hereby appointed judge, and David Prosser and John Headrick inspectors, to hold the elections in said borough until others are elected for that purpose. Erected into a separate election district.

SECTION 3. That the auditor general of the state be and he is hereby authorized and directed to examine into the claims of Jonathan Large, late brigade inspector of the first brigade, fifteenth division, Pennsylvania militia, for costs on suit authorized to be entered against Robert Lee, junior, and Robert Lee, senior, by the auditor general; and also for rent paid by the said brigade inspector for a depository of arms, if the same shall have been authorized by the adjutant general, or any existing law, and report to the legislature at as early a day as practicable. Auditor general authorized to examine the claim of Jonathan Large, late brigade inspector.

SECTION 4. That Daniel Stanard, James Taylor, Robert Mitchell, senior, Alexander Taylor, James Sutton, Edward Paige, William Houston, senior, Samuel Primble, senior, William Banks, James Baily, John Houston, James Moorhead, Abraham Lydick, William Evans, John Barr, Archibald Stewart, Samuel Howe, senior, Edward O'Neil, George Spalding, Robert Huston, John Clark, Edward Turner, James D. Baldwin, Benjamin Pitman, junior, John Armstrong, E. B. Camp, George Gamble, of Indiana county, A. B. Waller, Reader King, Edward King, of Clearfield county, and John Kinport, of Cambria county, or any five of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company, by the name, style and title of "The Indiana and Cherry Tree plank road company," to locate and construct a plank road, or a road partly plank and partly turnpike, from the borough of Indiana, to the Cherry Tree or Canoe place, on the Susquehanna river, in Indiana county, subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act, entitled "An Act regulating turnpike and plank road companies," approved the twenty-sixth act. day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, and the supplement thereto, so far as the said act and the supplements are not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

Capital stock.

SECTION 5. That the capital stock of said company shall consist of one thousand shares, at twenty dollars per share: *Provided*, That the said company may from time to time, at a meeting or meetings of the stockholders called for that purpose, increase their capital stock to such an amount as in their opinion may be required to complete the said road, according to the true intent and meaning of this act.

Commencement and completion of road.

SECTION 6. That the said company shall commence the construction of said road within three years from the passage of this act, and should the said company fail to complete the said road within fifteen years from and after the same shall have been commenced, then this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary for the purpose of settling the affairs and paying the debts of said company.

AN ACT

To prohibit the sale of spirituous liquors to Indians in Warren county; to incorporate the Philadelphia steam pump and towing company; and to authorize Isaac Heister to sell and convey certain real estate.

Penalty for selling spirituous liquors to the Indians in Warren county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the passage of this act it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to sell, or cause to be sold, within the county of Warren, to any Indian or Indians, any spirituous or vinous liquors; and any person or persons so offending against the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay a penalty of thirty dollars for each offence, the one-half thereof to the person who shall sue for and recover the same, and the other half to the overseers of the poor of the borough or township where the offence is committed; which penalty may be recovered as debts of like amount are now by law recoverable.
