AN ACT

To authorize the investigation of the claim of Jacob Hill.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to investigate the claim of Jacob Hill, of Armstrong county, for money and materials furnished by him for the use of the commonwealth, to James F. M'Gague, late surpervisor of the Western division of the Pennsylvania canal, for the purpose of repairing dams number one, two and three on said division, and make a full report of the facts to the legislature.
