A N A C T

To incorporate the Titusville and Youngsville plank road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Jonathan Watson, William Robinson, Morgan Weed, Peter Zelic, Commissioners. Thomas B. Watson, John M'Kinny, Carter Kinnear, H. P. Kinnear, William Siggins, S. S. Bates, John M. Titus, Philip Mead, second, Chauncey Smith, and such others as may hereafter become associated with them, are hereby declared to be a body corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of "The Titusville and Youngsville plank road company;" and by that name have perpetual succession, Style. and all the privileges and franchises of a corporation, and capable of holding their capital stock and enlarging the same in such manner as they may think proper, and of buying and holding such real and personal estate as may be necessary for the construction of said road, and of suing and being sued, and of pleading and being impleaded, and all other matters and things which a corporation may lawfully do. Privileges.

SECTION 2. That the capital stock of said company shall consist of six hundred shares of twenty-five dollars each share: *Provided, That* said company may from time, by a vote of the stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose, increase their capital stock so much as in their opinion may be deemed necessary to complete the road, and to carry out the true intent and meaning of this act. Capital stock.

SECTION 3. That the said company shall have power to construct a plank road from Titusville, in Crawford county, to Youngsville, in Warren county, by such route as shall be best and most practicable, and shall have the privilege of intersecting the Titusville and Warren plank road at any point they may think proper, and shall have power to lay the track of said road on any public or private road that shall be deemed necessary; and the directors shall have power to alter, close or vacate any road superseded by said plank road, and shall be subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, excepting so much as is altered by this act, and excepting that portion of the thirteenth section of said act relating to tolls, which discriminates in favor of wheels of a greater width than four inches; and the said company shall have power to regulate their tolls within the limits prescribed by said thirteenth section, without reference to the width of wheels in any case. Location. Subject to provisions of certain act.

SECTION 4. That when the said company shall have finished three miles or more of said road, the president thereof may give notice to the governor, who shall thereupon do and perform the duties prescribed in the twelfth section of said act of the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine. Letters patent.

SECTION 5. That the said company shall have power to connect with the Meadville, Allegheny and Brokenstraw plank road, or any other plank road running along the valley of the Brokenstraw, at or near Youngsville, or continue the same to Warren. May connect with Meadville, Allegheny and Brokenstraw plank road.

Election of officers. SECTION 6. That whenever one hundred shares shall be subscribed of twenty-five dollars each, any three stockholders may call a meeting by putting up written or printed notices in at least four of the most public places along said contemplated road, for the election of one person as president, and four persons as directors, who shall form an executive board; and one person as treasurer and one person as superintendent, who shall hold their office for the term of one year, and until their successors are elected.

Commencement and completion of road. SECTION 7. That if the said company shall not commence the construction of the said road within three years after the granting of this charter, and complete the same within ten years thereafter, this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary to wind up the affairs and pay the debts of said company.

AN ACT

Extending Pickering street, in the borough of Brookville, Jefferson county, Pennsylvania; and incorporating the Graphic association of Philadelphia.

Pickering street, in Brookville, extended. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Pickering street, in the borough of Brookville, Jefferson county, Pennsylvania, be and the same is hereby extended from the south-east corner of the bridge over Red Bank creek, in said borough; south along the west side of the out lots until the same shall strike the aforesaid creek; that part so extended to be thirty-five feet in width.

Commissioners. SECTION 2. That E. Heath, J. B. Evans and Philip Taylor, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to survey and lay out the aforesaid street.

Incorporate. SECTION 3. That the members of the association called the Graphic association of Philadelphia, and all such persons as now are or may be hereafter admitted members of said association, shall be and they are hereby declared a body politic and corporate by the name and style of "The Graphic association of Philadelphia," to have perpetual succession, and be capable to take, hold and enjoy lands, tenements and hereditaments; to use a common seal, and to break, alter or renew the same at pleasure: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value of the real estate by them held, shall not exceed three thousand dollars.
