A N A C T

To extend the charter of the Kensington Bank, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the charter of the Kensington Bank, in the county of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby extended and continued for the term of fifteen years, from the expiration of its present charter, subject to all the restrictions and provisions, and with all the privileges contained in an act, entitled "An Act regulating banks," approved the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, as fully as if the several sections of the said last recited act were herein literally repeated and set forth.

A N A C T

To authorize the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal church of Trough creek to make sale of a certain parsonage; and relative to the Glen Hope and Little Bald Eagle turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the trustees of the parsonage house of the Methodist Episcopal church of Trough Creek circuit, Baltimore conference, be and they are hereby authorized to sell the said parsonage house and lot of ground and premises, with the appurtenances, situate in Tod township, in the county of Huntingdon, for the best price that can be obtained for the same, and make a deed therefor to the purchaser; and after paying the debts against the same, (if any there be,) to invest the proceeds of said sale in

the purchase of another suitable property, to be held and enjoyed by the said church for the same uses and purposes as the former property was held and enjoyed.

SECTION 2. That the Glen Hope and Little Bald Eagle turnpike road company are hereby authorized and empowered to extend and make the turnpike road from Glen Hope, in Clearfield county, to the town of Packersville, in the same county, and from the mouth of the Little Bald Eagle creek, in Blair county, to the junction of Market and Tyrone streets of Birmingham, in Huntingdon county, in like manner and with like powers and privileges, and under like restrictions and conditions as the said company is authorized and empowered to make said turnpike road from Glen Hope to Little Bald Eagle aforesaid; and the supervisors of the several townships through which said turnpike road shall and will pass and be made, who shall be elected in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, or in any year thereafter, are hereby authorized and empowered to subscribe and pay such number of shares of, in and to the capital stock of said company as they, the said supervisors of townships through which said road shall and will be made, shall deem proper and expedient; and the said supervisors are hereby authorized and empowered to pay the amount of stock they may subscribe as aforesaid, by the addition of such a rate of taxation to the ordinary township rates as may be required for said object, or may borrow such an amount, if by them, the said supervisors, it be deemed proper and expedient so to do: *Provided*, That the loan thus authorized shall not exceed, for any one township, the sum of one thousand dollars.

SECTION 3. That the managers of the said turnpike road or commissioners specially elected for the purpose, by the stockholders of said company, be and are hereby authorized and empowered to borrow the sum of five thousand dollars, or any additional sum not exceeding an aggregate of ten thousand dollars, for the purpose of making and completing said turnpike road to its termini at Packersville, in Clearfield county, and Birmingham, in Huntingdon county.
