A N A C T

To fix the number of senators and representatives, and form the state into districts, in pursuance of the provisions of the constitution.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That until the next enumeration of the taxable inhabitants, and an apportionment thereon, the senate, at a ratio of fourteen thousand seven hundred and forty-three, shall consist of thirty-three members, and be apportioned as follows, to wit:

I. The city of Philadelphia shall compose the first district and elect two members.

II. The county of Philadelphia shall compose the second district and elect three members.

III. The county of Montgomery shall compose the third district and elect one member.

IV. The counties of Chester and Delaware shall compose the fourth district and elect one member.

V. The county of Berks shall compose the fifth district and elect one member.

VI. The county of Bucks shall compose the sixth district and elect one member.

VII. The counties of Lancaster and Lebanon shall compose the seventh district and elect two members.

VIII. The counties of Northumberland and Dauphin shall compose the eighth district and elect one member.

IX. The counties of Northampton and Lehigh shall compose the ninth district and elect one member.

X. The counties of Carbon, Monroe, Pike and Wayne shall compose the tenth district and elect one member.

XI. The counties of Adams and Franklin shall compose the eleventh district and elect one member.

XII. The county of York shall compose the twelfth district and elect one member.

XIII. The counties of Cumberland and Perry shall compose the thirteenth district and elect one member.

XIV. The counties of Centre, Lycoming, Sullivan and Clinton shall compose the fourteenth district and elect one member.

XV. The counties of Blair, Cambria and Huntingdon shall compose the fifteenth district and elect one member.

XVI. The counties of Luzerne, Montour and Columbia shall compose the sixteenth district and elect one member.

XVII. The counties of Bradford, Susquehanna and Wyoming shall compose the seventeenth district and elect one member.

XVIII. The counties of Tioga, Potter, M'Kean, Elk, Clearfield and Jefferson shall compose the eighteenth district and elect one member.

XIX. The counties of Mercer, Venango and Warren shall compose the nineteenth district and elect one member.

XX. The counties of Erie and Crawford shall compose the twentieth district and elect one member.

XXI. The counties of Butler, Beaver and Lawrence shall compose the twenty-first district and elect one member.

XXII. The county of Allegheny shall compose the twenty-second district and elect two members.

XXIII. The counties of Washington and Greene shall compose the twenty-third district and elect one member.

XXIV. The counties of Bedford and Somerset shall compose the twenty-fourth district and elect one member.

XXV. The counties of Armstrong, Indiana and Clarion shall compose the twenty-fifth district and elect one member.

XXVI. The counties of Juniata, Mifflin and Union shall compose the twenty-sixth district and elect one member.

XXVII. The counties of Westmoreland and Fayette shall compose the twenty-seventh district and elect one member.

XXVIII. The county of Schuylkill shall compose the twenty-eighth district and elect one member.

Return judges'
duties.

SECTION 2. In those districts which are composed of more than one county, the judges of the district elections within each county, after having formed a return of the whole election within such county, in such manner as is or may be directed by law, shall send the same by one of their number to the place hereinafter mentioned within the district of which such county is a part, when the judges so met shall cast up the several county returns, and execute, under their hands and seals, one general and true return for the whole district, to wit:

The judges of the first and second districts shall meet at the state house in the city of Philadelphia.

The judges of the third district will meet at the court house in the borough of Norristown, in Montgomery county.

The judges of the fourth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of West Chester, in the county of Chester.

The judges of the fifth district shall meet at the court house in the city of Reading, in the county of Berks.

The judges of the sixth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Doylestown, in the county of Bucks.

The judges of the seventh district shall meet at the court house in the city of Lancaster.

The judges of the eighth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Harrisburg, in the county of Dauphin.

The judges of the ninth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Easton, in the county of Northampton.

The judges of the tenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Stroudsburg, in the county of Monroe.

The judges of the eleventh district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Chambersburg, in the county of Franklin.

The judges of the twelfth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of York, in the county of York.

The judges of the thirteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland.

The judges of the fourteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Williamsport, in the county of Lycoming.

The judges of the fifteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Hollidaysburg, in the county of Blair.

The judges of the sixteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Bloomsburg, in the county of Columbia.

The judges of the seventeenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Montrose, in the county of Susquehanna.

The judges of the eighteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Condersport, in the county of Potter.

The judges of the nineteenth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Franklin, in the county of Venango.

The judges of the twentieth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Erie, in the county of the Erie.

The judges of the twenty-first district shall meet at the court house in the borough of New Castle, in the county of Lawrence.

The judges of the twenty-second district shall meet at the court house in the city of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny.

The judges of the twenty-third district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Washington, in the county of Washington.

The judges of the twenty-fourth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Somerset, in the county of Somerset.

The judges of the twenty-fifth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Kittanning, in the county of Armstrong.

The judges of the twenty-sixth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Lewistown, in the county of Mifflin.

The judges of the twenty-seventh district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Greensburg, in the county of Westmoreland.

The judges of the twenty-eighth district shall meet at the court house in the borough of Orwigsburg, in the county of Schuylkill.

SECTION 3. That until the next enumeration of taxables, and apportionment thereon made, the house of representatives, a ratio of four thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, shall consist of one hundred members, to wit:

The county of Adams shall be entitled to one member.

The county Allegheny to five members.

The counties of Bedford and Cambria to two members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Bedford, in the county of Bedford.

The county of Berks to four members.

The county of Bucks to three members.

The counties of Beaver, Butler and Lawrence to three members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of New Castle, in the county of Lawrence.

The counties of Blair and Huntingdon to two members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Huntingdon, in the county of Huntingdon.

The county of Bradford to two members.

The county of Chester shall be entitled to three members.

The county of Cumberland shall be entitled to two members.

The county of Centre to one member.

The counties of Clearfield, Elk and M'Kean to one member, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in Ridgway, in the county of Elk.

The counties of Armstrong, Clarion and Jefferson to three members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Clarion, in the county of Clarion.

The counties of Columbia and Montour shall be entitled to one member, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Bloomsburg, in Columbia county.

The county of Dauphin shall be entitled to two members.

The county of Delaware to one member.

The county of Erie to two members.

The county of Washington to two members.

The counties of Fayette and Westmoreland to four members, and the return judges shall meet in the court house in the borough of Greensburg, in the county of Westmoreland.

The county of Franklin to two members.

The county of Indiana to one member.

The county of Lebanon to one member.

The counties of Lycoming, Clinton and Potter to two members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Williamsport, in the county of Lycoming.

The county of Lancaster to five members.

The county of Luzerne shall be entitled to two members.

The counties of Lehigh and Carbon to two members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in Allentown, in the county of Lehigh.

The counties of Monroe and Pike shall be entitled to one member, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Milford, in the county of Pike.

The counties of Mercer, Venango and Warren shall be entitled to three members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Franklin, in the county of Venango.

The county of Crawford shall be entitled to two members.

The county of Mifflin to one member.

The county of Montgomery shall be entitled to three members.

The county of Northampton to two members.

The county of Northumberland to one member.

The county of Perry to one member.

The city of Philadelphia shall be entitled to four members.

The county of Philadelphia to eleven members.

The county of Somerset to one member.

The county of Schuylkill to two members.

The counties of Susquehanna, Sullivan and Wyoming to two members, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the borough of Montrose, in the county of Susquehanna.

The county of Tioga to one member.

The county of Wayne to one member.

The county of Greene to one member.

The counties of Union and Juniata to one member, and the return judges shall meet at the court house in the town of New Berlin, in the county of Union.

The county of York shall be entitled to three members.

Manner of election.

SECTION 4. The senators and representatives shall be chosen by the duly qualified citizens of the city of Philadelphia and the several counties of this commonwealth; at the time, manner and places prescribed by the constitution and the laws of this commonwealth.

Time of choosing senators.

SECTION 5. The senators shall be chosen in the several districts, at the following times, to wit :

In the first district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and one senator in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

In the second district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and one at the general election in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and one at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

In the third district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

In the fourth district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

In the fifth district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

In the sixth district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

In the seventh district, two senators shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

In the eighth district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

In the ninth district, one senator shall be chosen at the general election in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

In the tenth district, one senator shall be chosen in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

AN ACT

To authorize the governor to incorporate the Lock Haven bridge company.

Commissioners.

Form of sub-
scription.

Proviso.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* George W. Hollenbake, Jacob Grafius, E. L. Shultze, L. A. Mackey, William C. Sanderson, George Schnable, Allison White, J. P. Huling, Peter Dickison, J. A. Crawford, D. K. Jackman, William White, Joseph Hanna, Nathaniel Hanna, James T. Hale, James Burnside, Samuel M'Cormick, Jarid H. Irwin, John S. Furst, John Fleming, John P. Packer, J. C. King and Philip Krebs, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned; that is to say, they shall, on or before the first day of August next, procure one or more books, and therein enter as follows: "We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company for the erection of a bridge over the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, in the pool of the Dunnstown dam at Lock Haven, the sum of twenty-five dollars for every share of stock in the said company, set opposite our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers in pursuance of an act of the general assembly, entitled "An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate the Lock Haven bridge company," and shall thereupon proceed to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company, at such times, and places as they shall think proper: *Provided always,* That every person so subscribing in his own name, or in the name of any other person, shall previously pay to the attending commissioners one dollar for every share so subscribed; out of which shall be paid the expense of taking such subscriptions, and other incidental charges, and the remainder shall
