AN ACT

Annulling the marriage contract between Daniel Gross and Barbara his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the contract of marriage entered into between Daniel Gross, of the township of North Whitehall, county of Lehigh, and Barbara his wife, be, and the same is hereby declared null and void, and the parties discharged from all the obligations and liabilities growing out of the same as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage.*
