AN ACT

To revive and extend the act entitled "An Act to graduate lands on which money is due and unpaid to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania," passed the tenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* all the provisions of the act entitled "An Act to graduate lands on which the money is due and unpaid to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania," passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, shall be, and the same are hereby revived and continued until the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and no longer.

SECTION 2. That the time for patenting the in-lots and out-lots in the towns of Erie, Waterford, Beaver, Franklin, and Warren, authorized to be appraised by the fifth section of the act entitled "An Act empowering the Burgess and Town Council of the borough of Erie to borrow money and to supply the said borough with water, and for other purposes," passed the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight be, and the same is hereby revived and extended until the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and no longer.
