A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the subscribers to the articles of association for the purpose of establishing a House of Refuge," passed March twenty-third, eighteen hundred and twenty-six.

WHEREAS, Owing to the increased population of the Commonwealth, the accommodations in the House of Refuge have become inadequate, and the erection of larger and more suitable buildings, in which a more perfect classification of the inmates may be made, has become necessary: Preamble.

And whereas, The board of managers of the said House of Refuge, have memorialized the Legislature, praying that the sum of sixty thousand dollars may be appropriated for the purpose of enabling the said board to accomplish this desirable object; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated towards the erection of new buildings for the accommodation of white juvenile delinquents, which said sum of fifteen thousand dollars shall be paid out of the treasury of the Commonwealth, to the treasurer of the said House of Refuge, in manner following, to wit: five thousand dollars thereof on or before the first day of September next; five thousand dollars thereof on or before the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and the remaining five thousand dollars thereof on or before the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four. State appropriation.

SECTION 2. That for the purposes aforesaid, the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia shall draw their order on the treasurer of the said county, on or before the first day of May next, in favor of the treasurer of the House of Refuge for the sum of fifteen thousand dollars; and shall on or before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, draw a like order for the further sum of fifteen thousand dollars; and shall on or before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, draw a like order for the further sum of fifteen thousand dollars, and the whole of said sum of sixty thou- Amount to be paid by the county of Philadelphia.

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sand dollars hereby appropriated shall, as the same shall be from time to time received by the said board of managers, be appropriated towards the erection of new buildings for the accommodation of white juvenile delinquents, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

AN ACT

For the relief of Henry R. Graybill.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, A serious accident happened on the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, on the cabin of the boat "Hungarian," used as a towing boat in crossing the Susquehanna river at Clark's ferry, from the bursting of one of the fluid lamps in use on said boat, by which Henry R. Graybill, then employed by the Commonwealth as an engineer upon said boat, was so severely injured and disabled as to render him entirely unable to maintain himself and family by bodily labor; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be authorized and required to pay out of any monies in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of nine hundred and forty dollars, to Henry R. Graybill, or to his legal representatives, as a full compensation for the injuries sustained by him.
