AN ACT

Relative to the Pittsburg and Steubenville Railroad Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Pittsburgh and Steubenville railroad company is hereby authorized to issue its bonds, secured by mortgage or otherwise, heretofore by law authorized, bearing any rate of interest not exceeding seven per cent., and any sale of said bonds for a less amount than their par value, shall not be construed to be a violation of the usury laws of this State*

SECTION 2. That the Pittsburgh and Steubenville railroad company be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to make any bonds or certificates of loan, which it has heretofore been authorized to issue for the construction and equipment of its road, convertible into the stock of its company at par, or on such terms as may be agreed upon.
