AN ACT

To legalize the appeal of Thomas Morris from the decision of the Auditor General and State Treasurer.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the appeal of Thomas Morris, from the decision of the Auditor General and State Treasurer, now pending in the court of common pleas of Dauphin county, number fifty eight, November term, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, shall be considered as regularly taken, and the said cause shall be tried on its merits, without any objections being made as to the jurisdiction of the court or the form of the appeal: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect any account or items thereof, which may have been settled previous to any notice by said Morris to the Auditor General, that he had not received the money for which vouchers were presented by the Superintendent of the Columbia railroad for settlement.
