A N A C T

In relation to the Church and Burying Ground of the United Brethren and Associate Reformed Congregations in Mount Pleasant, Westmoreland county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* George Barger, Christian Ebersol, David Keister and David S. Cheny, trustees of the church of the United Brethren in Christ, in the borough of Mount Pleasant, Westmoreland county, are hereby made capable in law, to convey to John Hunter, Samuel Warden, Joseph Andrews and John Andrews, trustees of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church in said borough, the entire estate and interest of the said church of the United Brethren in Christ, being the one undivided half part of that certain church, churchyard and burying ground in the borough of Mount Pleasant, which the two congregations have owned and occupied, as tenants in common, since the year eighteen hundred and twelve, reserving only to the members of the said church of the United Brethren in Christ, the right forever of burying their dead in the graveyard belonging to the premises hereby intended to be ceded, in common with the members of the Associate Reformed church.

Confirming the title to certain Real Estate in the City of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* no statute of mortmain, nor any other disabling statute act of Assembly, or law whatever, shall invalidate the title to two certain lots or pieces of ground, one of them situate at the southwest corner of Schuylkill Fourth, (now Nineteenth street,) and Lombard street in the city of Philadelphia, containing in breadth on
