

now in effect or hereinafter effective. The compensation of the school police, if any, shall be fixed by the borough council and shall be paid jointly by the borough council and the board of school directors, in a ratio to be determined by the borough council and board of school directors. If the borough council and board of school directors are unable to determine the ratio of compensation of the police to be paid by the council and board, each shall pay one-half of the compensation of such police.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 347

Amending the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending, and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," providing for the appropriation of money for rescue and life saving units.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause XIX of section 1202, act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 519), known as "The Borough Code," reenacted and amended July 10, 1947 (P. L. 1621) and amended July 19, 1951 (P. L. 1026), is amended to read:

Section 1202. Specific Powers.—The powers of the borough shall be vested in the corporate officers. They shall have power:

\* \* \*

XIX. Fire Rescue and Life Saving Apparatus and Houses.—To purchase, or contribute to the purchase of, fire-engines and fire-apparatus, boats, rescue and life saving equipment and supplies for the use of the borough, and to appropriate money to fire companies, rescue units and for the construction, repair, and maintenance of fire company and rescue unit houses, including the acquisition of land for such purposes.
