traps for dog training purposes contrary to the provisions of this article, twenty-five dollars.

Upon failure of any person convicted of a first offense to immediately pay the fine imposed and cost of prosecution, he shall be imprisoned one day for each dollar of fine imposed and cost of prosecution.

Any person convicted of a second or subsequent offense shall be liable to the fines above provided and costs of prosecution, and, in addition thereto, shall, in the discretion of the court, suffer imprisonment one day for each dollar of fine imposed.

SB 1007

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative depart-ments, boards, commissions and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appoint-ment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards and computes and other assistants and manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other as-sistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," further providing for the powers and duties of the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (e) of section 1902, act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," amended June 8, 1965 (Act No. 82) (P. L. 120), is amended to read:

Section 1902. Mines.-The Department of Mines and Mineral Industries shall have the power and its duty shall be---

(e) To seal or close or backfill abandoned deep or strip coal mines, to fill voids in abandoned coal mines, to drill bore holes, dig ditches or construct flumes which would relieve flooding or hazardous conditions caused by mine water, and to extinguish fires in abandoned coal mines and in culm banks, in those instances where such work is in the interest of the public welfare.

SB 1084

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor and the Secretary of Public Welfare, to convey 29.173 acres, more or less, of land situate in the Township of Upper St. Clair, Allegheny County, to the School District of the Township of Upper St. Clair.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor and the Secretary of Public Welfare, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to convey to the School District of the Township of Upper St. Clair for a consideration of one dollar (\$1), the following described tract of land situate in the Township of Upper St. Clair, County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center line of Morton Road, said point being the northwesterly corner of property now or late of F. Thompson; thence along said center line of said Morton Road south 1 degree 7 minutes east, a distance of 1,143.83 feet to a point; thence through property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania south 88 degrees 53 minutes west 995.02 feet to a point; thence continuing through property of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania north 1 degree 7 minutes west, a distance of 1,451.53 feet to a point on the line of property now or late of E. G. Underhill; thence along said line of said property of E. G. Underhill, south 68 degrees 10 minutes 30 seconds east a distance of 388.75 feet to a point; thence continuing along said line of property of E. G. Underhill and through the right-of-way of Morrow Road, south 77 degrees 20 minutes 30 seconds east, a distance of 655.88 feet to a
