## AN ACT

HB 312

Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), entitled "An act relating to counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," authorizing the closing of court houses and certain other county offices on Saturdays in counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2301.1, act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), known as "The County Code," added July 17, 1961 (P. L. 776), is amended to read:

Section 2301.1. Saturday Closing [in Third Class Counties.] of Court House and Offices.—In counties of the third [class], fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes, the county commissioners may order that the county court house and all county offices located elsewhere except voters registration offices during the period of time that persons are eligible to register be closed all day on Saturdays throughout the year or during any specified period of the year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

## AN ACT

HB 1156

Amending the act of June 21, 1957 (P. L. 358), entitled "An act concerning gifts of securities or money to minors; providing for custodians of such gifts and their powers and duties; defining the effect of the gifts on guardians of minors or their estates; conferring jurisdiction on orphans' courts, and absolving agents dealing with securities or money from certain responsibilities," further defining bank.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Clause (2) of section 2, act of June 21, 1957 (P. L. 358), known as the "Pennsylvania Uniform Gifts to Minors Act," is amended to read:

Section 2. Definitions.—The following words, terms and phrases when used in this act shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

\* \* \*

(2) A “bank” is a bank, bank and trust company, trust company, savings and loan association, building and loan association, national banking association or institution, [or] savings bank or credit union incorporated under the laws of the United States or under the laws of this Commonwealth.

AN ACT

HB 1921

Amending the act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), entitled “An act relating to counties of the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth classes; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto,” authorizing counties of the third class to appropriate money and provide for establishing crime detection laboratories and police training schools for the use of political subdivisions situated within such counties and the training of police employed by such political subdivisions.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Article XIX, act of August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), known as “The County Code,” is amended by adding at the end thereof a new subdivision to read:
