SB 910

Authorizing the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to acquire by gift on behalf of the Commonwealth certain land located in Whitemarsh Township, Montgomery County.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire by gift on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the hereinafter described lot or piece of ground with the buildings and improvements thereon erected known as the Mather Mill situate in Whitemarsh Township, Montgomery County, bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning at the point formed by the intersection of the center line of Mathers Lane (45 feet wide) and the title line in the bed of Skippack Pike (50 feet wide); thence extending along the title line in the bed of Skippack Pike North 44 degrees 30 minutes West crossing the Wissahickon Creek, 262 and $54/100$ feet to a point; thence extending North 24 degrees, 24 minutes East recrossing said creek, 270 and $27/100$ feet to an iron pin; thence extending South 87 degrees 20 minutes East 325 and $56/100$ feet to a point in the bed of said creek; thence extending along land now or late of Edward W. Heller the four following courses and distances viz: (1) through the bed of said creek South 17 degrees 8 minutes 30 seconds West 180 and $89/100$ feet to a point; (2) through the bed of said creek South 32 degrees 37 minutes West 20 and $63/100$ feet to a point; (3) partly through the bed of said creek South 23 degrees 1 minute East crossing the Southerly bank of said creek, 80 and $90/100$ feet to a stake; and (4) South 13 degrees 5 minutes 30 seconds East 112 and $78/100$ feet to a point in the center line of Mathers Lane aforesaid; thence extending along the center line of Mathers Lane South 79 degrees 55 minutes West 249 and $32/100$ feet to the first mentioned point and place of beginning, containing 3 and $185/1000$ acres, under and subject to certain utility rights now of record in Deed Book No. 2600, page 61, together with certain water rights now of record in Deed Book No. 646, page 89.

Section 2. Title to the property shall be taken in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and before its acceptance shall be approved by the Department of Justice.

Section 3. Upon acceptance of the title the Pennsylvania Historical

and Museum Commission shall be given full control, management and supervision thereof, shall preserve the historic Mather Mill and its grounds, and shall have the power to adopt and carry into effect plans for the improvement and maintenance thereof and to make and enforce rules and regulations for the preservation of the property and the visitation thereof by the public.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

HB 1473

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing a tabular salary schedule for the payment of minimum salaries and increments of principals, supervising principals, teachers and other professional employes of school districts; changing provisions relating to salaries of superintendents; providing for additional increments and adjustment increments; authorizing revision of budgets and temporary loans; and making an appropriation for bonus reimbursement to school districts of the Commonwealth.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1066 and 1075, act of March 10, 1949 (P. L. 30), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended June 1, 1956 (P. L. 1948), are amended to read:

Section 1066. Minimum Salaries; Payment.—All county superintendents, assistant county superintendents and supervisors of special education shall be entitled to the following minimum annual salaries:

(1) County superintendents in counties having a population of less than forty-five thousand (45,000), [nine thousand dollars (\$9000);] thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000);

(2) County superintendents in counties having a population of forty-five thousand (45,000) and more but less than one hundred fifty thousand (150,000), [ten thousand dollars (\$10,000);] fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000);

(3) County superintendents in counties having a population of one
