

Hill School Road and Brush Creek Road, North  $0^{\circ}$  for a distance of 1150.0 feet to a point; thence North  $61^{\circ} 50'$  West for a distance of 1920.0 feet to a point; thence North  $15^{\circ} 09' 35''$  West for a distance of 3786.06 feet to a point; thence South  $87^{\circ} 39'$  West for a distance of 1200.00 feet to a point on Freedom Road; thence North  $2^{\circ} 21'$  West for a distance of 763.13 feet to a point; thence North  $87^{\circ} 39'$  East on the southerly line of the lands of John and Leonard Steele for a distance of 1543.21 feet to a point; thence North  $56^{\circ} 38'$  East for a distance of 181.43 feet to a point; thence North  $80^{\circ} 23'$  East for a distance of 98.50 feet to a point; thence South  $83^{\circ} 47'$  East for a distance of 84.90 feet to a point; thence South  $73^{\circ} 27'$  East for a distance of 97.31 feet to a point; thence North  $87^{\circ} 11' 30''$  East for a distance of 594.65 feet to a point; thence South  $26^{\circ} 52' 32''$  East along the Turnpike right-of-way for a distance of 1180.49 feet to a point; thence on an arc as follows:  $\Delta = 0^{\circ} 42' 20''$ ,  $R = 11,359.19$ ,  $T = 69.97$ ,  $L = 139.77$  to a point; thence South  $14^{\circ} 14'$  East for a distance of 201.91 feet to a point; thence South  $16^{\circ} 06' 30''$  West for a distance of 510.34 feet to a point; thence South  $22^{\circ} 25'$  East for a distance of 287.64 feet to a point; thence South  $86^{\circ} 28'$  East for a distance of 407.40 feet to a point; thence on an arc as follows:  $\Delta = 0^{\circ} 38' 14''$ ,  $R = 11,359.19$ ,  $T = 63.16$ ,  $L = 126.22$  to a point; thence South  $20^{\circ} 09' 32''$  East to the intersection of the centerline of Thorn Hill School Road; thence westerly along the centerline of Thorn Hill School Road to the starting point.

The land shall not be acquired until its title has been approved by the Department of Justice.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 1231

Amending the act of July 17, 1961 (P. L. 659), entitled "An act relating to bituminous coal mines; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; providing for the health and safety of persons employed in and about the bituminous coal mines of Pennsylvania and for the protection and preservation of property connected therewith; prescribing powers and duties in connection therewith; prescribing penalties; and repealing existing laws," changing provisions relating to withdrawal of men from the mines on account of ventilation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 221, act of July 17, 1961 (P. L. 659), known as the "Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal Mine Act," is amended to read:

Section 221. Mine Foreman; Ventilation.—\* \* \*

(d) In case of accident to a ventilating fan or its machinery, or if the fan stoppage is a planned interruption whereby the ventilation of the mine [would be seriously] is interrupted, [or where the fan has been stopped for a period of time in excess of thirty minutes in a gassy mine and sixty minutes in a non-gassy mine,] the mine foreman shall order the power to be disconnected from the affected portions and withdraw the men immediately from the face areas. In mines employing the use of multiple fans equipped with self-closing doors which operate automatically when the fan is stopped, such action need not be taken provided the minimum requirements are met by other fans of the system. If the fan has been stopped for a period of time in excess of fifteen minutes in a gassy mine, and thirty minutes in a non-gassy mine, the mine foreman shall order the men withdrawn from the mine. If the mine foreman shall deem it necessary, he may withdraw the men from a gassy mine in less than the said [thirty] fifteen minutes and from a non-gassy mine in less than the said [sixty] thirty minutes. He shall not allow the men to return to their work until the ventilation has been restored, and the mine has been thoroughly examined by certified personnel and reported safe. A record shall be made of said examination.  
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Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
