

tinental certificates received in exchange for the said new loan certificates, (who on receiving the same) is hereby authorized and required to subscribe them to the loan of the United States, in trust for the use and benefit of the said Thomas Butler and Henry Brown, their heirs and assigns, respectively, and draw the interest due thereon, and pay the same, as well as such as shall hereafter become due and payable thereon, to the said Thomas Butler and Henry Brown, their heirs and assigns, respectively, reserving thereout such interest as shall appear to be already received from this commonwealth on said new loans respectively.

Provided nevertheless, That satisfactory security shall previously be given to the governor of this commonwealth, by the said Thomas Butler and Henry Brown, respectively, to indemnify the state for any loss that may be sustained in case the said new loan certificates shall hereafter be found.

CHAPTER MDCCXIX.

AN ACT TO REVIVE PART OF THE ACT ENTITLED "A SUPPLEMENT TO AN ACT ENTITLED 'AN ACT TO PREVENT INFECTIOUS DISEASES BEING BROUGHT INTO THIS PROVINCE.'"1

[Section I.] (Section I. P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act entitled "A Supplement to an act entitled 'An Act to prevent infectious diseases being brought into this province,'" passed the fifth day of September, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, be, and the same is hereby, revived, except the appropriation and limitation clauses thereof, and declared to be in as full force and virtue as if the same was herein recapitulated and re-enacted, anything in the said act to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

[Section II.] (Section II. P. L.) And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the governor be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to draw a warrant or warrants on the state treasurer for any sum not exceeding one thousand dollars, for the purpose of carrying this act into effect, to be paid out of the funds appropriated for the support of government.

CHAPTER MDCCXX.

A SUPPLEMENT TO THE ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO ENABLE THE GOVERNOR OF THIS COMMONWEALTH TO INCORPORATE A COMPANY FOR OPENING A CANAL AND LOCK NAVIGATION ON THE WATERS OF BRANDYWINE CREEK."¹

Whereas by the first section of the act entitled "An act to enable the governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for opening a canal and lock navigation on the waters of Brandywine creek,"¹ passed the tenth day of April last, the commissioners therein named were required to procure a book or books and open the same to receive subscriptions for shares of stock in the said company, in the manner and at the times in the said act mentioned; but the legislature of the state of Delaware not having passed a law at that time, enabling the subscribers to extend the said canal navigation from the place where the same shall intersect the line dividing this state from the state of Delaware, in and through the same state, into the tide waters of the river Delaware, the said commissioners could not, by reason of the provision contained in the twenty-first section of the said act, open the said book or books within the time by the said recited act limited. And whereas the legislature of the state of Delaware have since passed a law for the purposes aforesaid.
