

## CHAPTER MDCCLXXXVIII.

## AN ACT IN FAVOR OF NATHANIEL FALCONER.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That in the settlement of the accounts of Nathaniel Falconer, late health officer of the port of Philadelphia, the register and comptroller are hereby authorized and directed to credit the said officer for the amount of head money remitted by him to emigrants from Hispaniola, or paid to his deputy during his employment, in consequence of the late epidemic.

## CHAPTER MDCCLXXXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT TO THE ACT, ENTITLED, "AN ACT FOR ESTABLISHING AN HEALTH OFFICE, FOR OTHERWISE SECURING THE CITY AND PORT OF PHILADELPHIA FROM THE INTRODUCTION OF PESTILENTIAL AND CONTAGIOUS DISEASES, AND FOR REGULATING THE IMPORTATION OF GERMAN AND OTHER PASSENGERS."<sup>1</sup>

Whereas the act, entitled, "An act for establishing an health-office, for otherwise securing the city and port of Philadelphia from the introduction of pestilential and contagious diseases, and for regulating the importation of German and other passengers,"<sup>1</sup> passed the twenty-second day of April last, is found by experience to require alterations and amendments.
