CHAPTER MDCCXCIII.

AN ACT TO ERECT A NEW ELECTION DISTRICT IN DAUPHIN COUNTY.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the township of Middle Paxton, in the county of Dauphin, be, and the same is hereby, erected into a separate election district, to be called the seventh election district in the county aforesaid; and the freemen thereof are hereby authorized to hold their annual election at the house now occupied by John Ayres, in the manner and under the regulations prescribed by the constitution and laws of this commonwealth.
