

CHAPTER MCMXI.

AN ACT TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE RELIEF OF THE SUFFERERS BY THE LATE FIRES IN THE CITY OF SAVANNAH, IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA.

Whereas, it appears that many of the inhabitants of the city of Savannah, in Georgia have been reduced to great indigence and distress by the late fires in that city:

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it therefore enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby, authorized to draw on the treasurer of this commonwealth in favor of such persons as he may appoint, for the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, to be by them remitted to the mayor of the city of Savannah, to be distributed among the sufferers by the late fires in that city, in such manner as the magistrates thereof may direct.

CHAPTER MCMXII.

AN ACT FOR THE RELIEF OF HENRY PENFINGER.

[Section I.] (Section I, P. L.) Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby, authorized to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the sum of six hundred dollars, in favor of Henry Penfinger, a disabled soldier of the fourth Pennsylvania regiment, in the late
