Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and Houfe of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Affembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame,* That the title to all and fingular the above defcribed real eftates, with the appurtenances acquired by the faid Alexander Boaticar, by the deed of indenture made to him by the above named William Read and Ann his wife, and Matthew Pearce and Mary his wife, bearing date the fifth day of Auguft, one thousand eight hundred and two, recorded in the office for recording of deeds of the city and county of Philadelphia, in deed book E. F. No. 9, page 532, &c. fhall be deemed and taken to have been as firm, valid, and effectual in law; and the title conveyed by the faid Alexander Boaticar and Lucy his wife to the faid Lewis Bollman, by their deed of indenture, bearing date the twelfth day of Auguft, one thousand eight hundred and three, recorded in the office aforefaid, in deed book E. F. No. 15, page 178, &c. fhall be and remain as firm, valid, and effectual in law, to all intents and purpofes whatfoever, as if the faid Alexander Boaticar had previous thereto taken and fubfcribed a declaration

claration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States; any thing in the aforesaid act, entitled " An act to enable aliens, incertain cases, to purchase and hold real estate within this commonwealth," or in any other act to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding.

CHAPTER XV.
