

CHAPTER XXVIII.

An ACT for the Relief of Alexander Patterson.

WHEREAS it appears that Alexander Patterson, of Easton, in Northampton county, in the revolutionary war, performed as a captain, very essential services to this Commonwealth: Therefore,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That four hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby granted to the aforesaid Alexander Patterson; and also an annuity of one hundred dollars, to be paid half yearly, during his life; the aforesaid sums, to be paid out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury of this Commonwealth, on warrants drawn by the Governor, as in other cases.
