

CHAPTER XXXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled " An act to empower the overseers and guardians of the poor of the several townships of the commonwealth to recover certain fines, penalties and forfeitures, and for other purposes, passed the fourth day of April one thousand eight hundred and three.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all fines, penalties and forfeitures, paid into the hands of the overseers of the poor by virtue of the act to which this is a supplement, where there is no poor supported at the expence of the township, or where a surplus remains in the hands of the overseers of the poor after paying the expences that may arise in the execution of their office, then, in either case, it shall be the duty of the overseers of the poor, and they are hereby required, under the same penalty as provided in other cases, to pay over such sums as remain unexpended in their hands at the settlement of their accounts, to the supervisors of the highways, to be applied to the repair of the public roads in the respective townships, unless the township auditors shall judge

CHAPTER XXXV.

An ACT altering the place of holding the elections in Southampton township, in Somerset county.
