CHAPTER XXXV.

An ACT altering the place of holding the elections in Southampton township, in Somerset county.

CHAPTER XXXVI.

An ACT for the relief of John Gilchrist.

WHEREAS it appears that John Gilchrist, of the borough of Harriburgh, while in the service of this state in the late revolutionary war, received a wound, by reason whereof he is rendered unable to procure a maintenance by manual labour : Therefore,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the aforesaid John Gilchrist be, and he is hereby allowed an annuity of sixty-four dollars, from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and three, and to continue during his life,
