which he now receives from the United States, sent pension, from the first day of January one thousand se-granted to D, ven hundred and ninety-sive, for and during life. his natural life, to be paid to him or his lawful attorney, in the manner following, to wit: One hundred and eight dollars for the first nine years immediately after the passing of this act, and afterwards in half yearly payments, from the said first day of January one thousand eight hundred and four, on warrants to be drawn by the Governor out of any of the unappropriated monies in the treasury of this commonwealth.

## CHAPTER CI.

An ACT for the Relief of Nicholas Reem.

HEREAS it appears that Nicholas Reem (alias Nicholas Rheam) of Northumberland county, so early as the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, didenlist in the late revolutionary army for three years, or during the war, and continued therein as serjeant until some time in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty-one, when he was discharged by reason of wounds received in the service, which disabled him from longer

longer ferving his country in a military capacity: And whereas the faid Nicholas, prefuming on the justice of his claim, has petitioned the legislature to grant him a share of donation-land; and inafmuch as it appears both equitable and just, that the foldier, who, thro' the adverse fate of war was prevented from ferving to the end thereof by wounds, honorably received, is equally entitled to the rewards intended by a grateful country, for those who more fortunately survived that glorious and all-important fervice: Therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the-Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is Donation lands hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That granted to N. the officers of the land-office be, and they are hereby directed and required, to grant a patent to Nicholas Reem (alias Nicholas Rheam) his heirs and affigns, for fuch share of donation-land to which a ferjeant is entitled who ferved in the line of this state in the armies of the United States, to the end of the late revolutionary war.
