CHAPTER LXXV.

An ACT for the speedy Redemption of certain Certificates therein mentioned.

WHEREAS by an act, entitled, “An act to compensate David Meade and others,” passed the ninth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, certain certificates were issued as evidences of credits in favor of the said David Meade and others; and as a part of the debt created by the said certificates remains unpaid, and as justice to individuals, as well as the interest of the State, requires that it should be speedily extinguished: Therefore,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby*

hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be optional with the holders of certain certificates, usually called "Wyoming Credits," issued under "An act to compensate David Meade and others," passed the ninth day of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-six, as also the holders of those issued under an act, entitled, "An act for the relief of Peter Wikoff, Jonathan Bayard Smith, and others," passed the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and one, to receive from the treasury of this Commonwealth the amount of said certificates, or any of them, or to apply them in taking out warrants for lands, or in discharge of arrearages on former grants, and the warrantee or warrantees who may pay the purchase-money of the lands granted by any warrant or warrants, or any part of it in the certificates of either of the descriptions aforesaid, shall be as liable to the payment of fees, and the conditions of settlement and cultivation, as is or may be required of those who pay the purchase-money in specie, and no credit shall be hereafter allowed to any person paying for lands with the credits aforesaid, on account of expenses incurred in surveying or locating any lands; any custom or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Made optional with the holders of certain certificates, to receive the amount of them at the treasury, or apply them in payment for lands;

But the lands so paid for, not to be discharged from the condition of settlement.
