

## CHAPTER CLVII.

*An ACT authorising the Governor to contract with John Bioren, to print the Laws of this Commonwealth.*

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That in order to continue a

The Governor authorized to contract for the printing of 1,000 copies, in the volume form, of the laws of the three last sessions, with John Bioren, who is to give security, &c.

publication of the laws correspondent with and in continuation of the edition of Carey and Bioren, the Governor be, and hereby is authorized and required to contract with John Bioren, of the city of Philadelphia, printer, in behalf and for the use of this commonwealth; the said Bioren to give security on his part, for one thousand copies of the laws of the commonwealth, including three sessions of the Legislature preceding the present, to be printed on fine paper and with a good type, (a specimen whereof shall previously be delivered, and if approved by the Governor, shall be lodged in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth), to be handsomely lettered and bound with a complete index, proper notes and references, at a price not exceeding two dollars per copy, and also for three thousand copies of the next session after the present in a pamphlet form, at, and for the sum of twelve hundred dollars, and also for three thousand copies of the session of one thousand eight hundred seven eight, in a pamphlet form, at, and for the sum of twelve hundred dollars, and for one thousand copies handsomely bound and lettered with a complete index, pro-

and also for 3,000 copies of the sessions of 1806-7 and 1807-8, in the pamphlet form; and for 1,000 copies, bound and lettered, comprising the sessions of 1805-6, 1806-7 and 1807-8.

per notes and references, including the laws of the present and two succeeding sessions, at, and for the price of two dollars the copy: *Provided*, The same shall be equal to the specimen approved of and lodged in the secretary's office aforesaid.

Sec. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That so much of the resolution as authorized the secretary of the commonwealth, to receive proposals during the recess of the Legislature, for printing the laws, passed on the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and two, be, and hereby is rescinded, and also so much of any law or laws now in force authorizing the Governor to contract for the printing of the laws, as is or are hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed: *Provided always*, That no contract entered into by the Governor heretofore for printing the laws of the present session, shall in the least be impaired or affected thereby.

Repeal of so much of former laws, as is hereby altered or supplied.
