CHAPTER I.

An ACT to encourage the killing of Panthers.

SECTION I. *BE* it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, a reward of eight dollars for killing every full grown panther, and four dollars for killing every panther whelp, within any county of this commonwealth, shall be allowed to every person killing such panther or panthers; to be recovered and paid agreeably to the provisions of an act, entitled "An act to encourage the killing of wolves," passed the tenth day of March, anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and six; on proof of the facts according to the directions of the said act. Premium allowed for killing panthers.
