## AN ACT

Providing for the election of one person as register of wills and clerk of the orphans' court in counties of the fourth class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the qualified electors of each county of the fourth class, in which such offices are not so joined, shall at the first municipal election occurring after the passage of this act, and every four years thereafter, elect one person to fill the offices of register of wills and clerk of the orphans' court.

Counties of fourth class.

Election of register of wills and clerk of orphans' court.

Section 2. This act does not repeal the provisions of any existing local or special law.

## AN ACT

Regulating the hours of labor of policemen in cities of the third class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That it shall be unlawful for any city of the third class to employ, or to require, any police officer, to remain on duty for more than eight hours in any twenty-four consecutive hours, or more than fifty-six hours in any one week, unless in emergency cases for the suppression of riots or tumults or the preservation of the public peace. Nothing contained herein shall, however, prevent any such city from requiring any such police officer to remain on duty, or to work, sixteen hours, in any twenty-four consecutive hours, not more than one day each week, if required by a change in working hours or a change in shifts.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Repeal.
