AN ACT

To amend section one of an act approved the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred one), entitled "An act for the assignment of judges to districts other than their own, for the purpose of expediting business, with provision for their compensation," by extending the provisions of said act to judges of orphans' courts.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section one of an act approved the twenty-seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, one hundred one), entitled "An act for the assignment of judges to districts other than their own, for the purpose of expediting business, with provision for their compensation," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Judges willing to  
serve in other dis-  
tricts to file state-  
ment.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That any law judge of any court of common pleas, or *orphans' court*, who can spare the time to sit in the courts of any other judicial district for the disposal of business, and who is willing so to do, shall file with the prothonotary of the Supreme Court, within thirty days from the approval of this act and at convenient times thereafter, a statement of the
