

Section 11. The State Board for Vocational Education shall prescribe rules and regulations for the organization, management, and control of such schools. The boards of directors of vocational schools maintaining any such schools shall receive pupils from other districts so far as their facilities will permit, provided the rate of tuition is determined and paid in accordance with the provisions of the school law.

Rules and regulations.

Section 12. The provisions of this act shall be severable, and if any of the provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this act. It is hereby declared as the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had such unconstitutional provision not been included therein.

Constitutional provisions.

Section 13. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

Section 14. The provisions of this act do not repeal or in anywise affect any of the provisions of the existing laws of this Commonwealth providing for the establishment, maintenance, conduct or operation of vocational schools, departments or classes by school districts or unions of school districts.

Other laws not affected by this act.

Section 15. The provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.

When effective.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Secretary of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor and the Secretary of Forests and Waters, to convey to the Pennsylvania State College, subject to certain reservations and conditions, the Mont Alto State Forest School, and to accept a conveyance from said college of a tree nursery tract.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, through the Secretary of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor and the Secretary of Forests and Waters, shall have power to convey in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the Pennsylvania State College for forest school purposes, subject to certain reservations and conditions, the property of the State Forest School, comprising 37.7 acres more or less, located partly in the Borough of Mont Alto and the Township of Quincey, in Franklin County, together with the buildings and improvements thereon erected; and to accept a conveyance, from the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State College to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, of the tree

nursery of five acres more or less, located at the intersection of Mont Alto and Tomstown Roads at the entrance of the Pennsylvania State Forest School, Franklin County, which is bounded by properties of D. M. Wertz, the Protestant Episcopal Church, State Forest land, Corbin Elden, and John Parker.

**Deed.**

The deed of conveyance for said state forest school property shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth. The deed for the conveyance of the tree nursery tract to the Commonwealth, after being recorded in the office of the recorder of deeds of Franklin County, shall be deposited with the Department of Internal Affairs. Both of such deeds shall be approved by the Department of Justice.

Section 2. The buildings to be included in said conveyance of the State Forest School by the Commonwealth to the Pennsylvania State College shall include the dormitory, cottage number one, double cottage, Weistling Hall, cottage number two, cottage number three, Science Hall, and the garage; but said buildings and the lands hereby authorized to be conveyed shall be conveyed subject to the following reservations and conditions:

**Conditions.**

(a) That the Department of Forests and Waters shall have the right to use cottage number one for such period of time as it deems necessary as a residence for the district forester.

(b) That the Department of Forests and Waters shall have the right to occupy and use, for such period of time as it deems necessary, the quarters in Science Hall now used as a district office and forest research offices, and shall retain title to the furniture, equipment, books, and instruments therein located; and

(c) That the Department of Forests and Waters shall have the right to occupy and use three rooms in Weistling Hall, selected by it, and the furniture and household furnishings therein located for such period of time as it deems necessary.

(d) All other furniture, fixtures, and other personal property not so reserved shall become the property of the Pennsylvania State College.

(e) That the Pennsylvania State College shall continue to maintain, operate, and use said lands and buildings for forest school purposes, and in case such maintenance, operation, and use shall be discontinued, said lands and buildings shall revert to the Commonwealth.

**Effective date.**

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately upon its final enactment.
