AN ACT

To apportion the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania into congressional districts.

Congressional  
reapportion-

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of electing representatives of the people of Pennsylvania to serve in the House of Representatives in the Congress of the United States, this Commonwealth shall be divided into thirty-three districts, which shall have one congressman each, as follows:

First district.

The first district shall consist of the first, second, third, fourth, twenty-sixth, thirtieth, thirty-sixth, thirty-ninth and forty-eighth wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Second district.

The second district shall consist of the twenty-seventh, thirty-fourth, fortieth, forty-fourth, forty-sixth, fifty-first and fifty-second wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Third district.

The third district shall consist of the fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth, twenty-fifth, thirty-first and forty-fifth wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Fourth district.

The fourth district shall consist of the twenty-fourth, twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth, thirty-second, thirty-seventh, thirty-eighth and forty-seventh wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Fifth district.

The fifth district shall consist of the twenty-third, thirty-third, thirty-fifth, forty-first and forty-third wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Sixth district.

The sixth district shall consist of the twenty-first, twenty-second, forty-second, forty-ninth and fiftieth wards of the city of Philadelphia.

Seventh district.

The seventh district shall consist of the county of Delaware.

Eighth district.

The eighth district shall consist of the counties of Bucks and Lehigh.

Ninth district.

The ninth district shall consist of the counties of Lancaster and Chester.

Tenth district.

The tenth district shall consist of the county of Lackawanna.

The thirtieth district shall consist of the twenty-first, twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh wards of the city of Pittsburgh, the boroughs of Aspinwall, Avalon, Bellevue, Ben Avon, Ben Avon Heights, Blawnox, Brackenridge, Bradford Woods, Cheswick, Edgeworth, Emsworth, Etna, Fox Chapel, Glenfield, Haysville, Leetsdale, Millvale, Osborne, Sewickley, Sewickley	Thirtieth district.

Heights, Sharpsburg, Springdale, Tarentum, West View, in the county of Allegheny, and the townships of Aleppo, East Deer, Fawn, Franklin, Frazer, Hampton, Harrison, Harmar, Indiana, Kilbuck, Leet, Marshall, McCandless, O'Hara, Ohio, Pine, Reserve, Richland, Ross, Sewickley, Sewickley Heights, Shaler, Springdale and West Deer in the county of Allegheny.

Thirty-first district.

The thirty-first district shall consist of the nineteenth, twentieth, twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth, thirtieth and thirty-second wards of the city of Pittsburgh, the boroughs of Brentwood, Bridgeville, Carnegie, Castle Shannon, Coraopolis, Crafton, Dormont, Greentree, Heidelberg, Ingram, Mt. Oliver, the fifth election district of McDonald, Oakdale, McKees Rocks, Rosslyn Farms, Thornburg, in the county of Allegheny, and the townships of Baldwin, Bethel, Collier, Crescent, Findlay, Kennedy, Mt. Lebanon, Moon, Neville, North Fayette, Robinson, Scott, South Fayette, Upper St. Clair and Stowe, in the county of Allegheny.

Thirty-second district.

The thirty-second district shall consist of the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, ninth, tenth, fifteenth, sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth, twenty-second, twenty-third and twenty-fourth wards of the city of Pittsburgh.

Thirty-third district.

The thirty-third district shall consist of the thirty-first ward of the city of Pittsburgh, the cities of Clairton, Duquesne and McKeesport, in the county of Allegheny, the boroughs of Braddock, Dravosburg, East Pittsburgh, East McKeesport, Elizabeth, Glassport, Homestead, Liberty, Munhall, North Braddock, Port Vue, Rankin, the first election district of Trafford, Turtle Creek, Versailles, Wall, Whitaker, West Homestead, West Elizabeth and Wilmerding, in the county of Allegheny, and the townships of Elizabeth, Forward, Jefferson, Lincoln, Mifflin, North Versailles, Snowden, South Versailles and Versailles, in the county of Allegheny.

First election in 1944.

Section 2. The first election under this act shall be held at the general election in the year one thousand nine hundred forty-four.

Present members shall continue until expiration of term.

The members of Congress now in office shall continue in such office until the expiration of their respective terms.

Vacancies occurring before 1944 election, shall be filled for unexpired term as heretofore.

Vacancies now existing or happening after the passage of this act, and before the commencement of the terms of the members elected at the election of one thousand nine hundred forty-four, shall be filled for the unexpired terms in the manner now provided by law.

Act of February 25, 1942, P. L. 7, repealed.

Section 3. The act, approved the twenty-fifth day of February, one thousand nine hundred forty-two (Pamphlet Laws, seven), entitled "An act concerning the election of representatives of the people of Penn-

sylvania to serve in the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States; providing for the apportionment of the Commonwealth into congressional districts, and for the election of one representative in Congress at large," is hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

All other acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Providing for the payment by the State Treasurer, of one-half of the amount of the tax on premiums paid by foreign casualty insurance companies, to the treasurers of the several cities, boroughs, towns and townships, and for the payment thereof into police pension funds, and in certain cases into the Municipal Employes' Retirement System, and in certain other cases into the State Employes' Retirement Fund, for certain purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. On and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four and annually thereafter, there shall be paid by the State Treasurer to the treasurers of the several cities, townships, towns and boroughs within the Commonwealth, one-half of the net amount received from the two per centum tax paid upon premiums by foreign casualty insurance companies. The amount to be paid to each of the treasurers of the several cities, townships, towns and boroughs shall be based upon the return of said two per centum tax upon premiums received from foreign casualty insurance companies doing business within the said cities, townships, towns and boroughs as shown by the report made to the Department of Revenue. Each city, borough, town or township receiving any payment from the State Treasurer hereunder shall forthwith pay the amount received into the police pension fund of such city, borough, town or township where such police pension fund exists or is hereafter established, if the said police pension fund is duly recognized as such by the council, commissioners or supervisors as the case may be of such city, borough, town or township. In any city, borough, town or township where the police elect to join the Municipal Employes' Retirement System created or hereafter created by law, the amount received by the treasurer of the city, borough, town or township

Police pension funds.

State Treasurer to turn over one-half of the 2 per cent tax paid by foreign casualty insurance companies upon premiums after January, 1944.
