

Every person who desires to obtain a license as employment representative shall apply therefor to the department in writing upon application blanks prepared and furnished by the department. Each application shall set forth such information as the department may require and shall be accompanied by the affidavits of two persons of business or professional integrity residing in the city, borough, town or township wherein the applicant resides. Such affiants shall state that they have known the applicant for a period of two years and that the applicant is a person of good moral character.

Application.

Content.

The department may require such other proof as to the honesty, truthfulness and integrity of the applicant as it deems necessary. If the applicant is shown to be honest, truthful and of known integrity, the department shall issue a license, which license shall set out the true name and address of the applicant, the name of the employment agent by which he is employed and such additional information as the department may prescribe. The license issued shall authorize the person named therein to act as a representative.

The department shall charge an annual fee of [five (\$5.00) dollars] *twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)* for issuing each such license, which fee shall be paid at the time application is made.

AN ACT

To amend section nine of the act, approved the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 2681), entitled "An act relating to, and regulating the manufacture, storing, and possession of explosives; requiring permits for magazines, and prescribing permit fees; and providing penalties," by increasing certain fees.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Explosives.

Section 1. Section nine of the act, approved the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 2681), entitled "An act relating to, and regulating the manufacture, storing, and possession of explosives; requiring permits for magazines, and prescribing permit fees; and providing penalties," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 9, act of July 1, 1937, P. L. 2681, amended.

Section 9. After January first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, every person storing or in

possession of explosives shall be required to have a license for each magazine used for the storing or placing of explosives, which license shall be issued on a form prepared and furnished by the Department of Labor and Industry. The application for license shall be accompanied by the proper license fee, which shall be prescribed by the department, according to the quantity of explosives which are to be stored or placed in the magazine, and shall not be less than [two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50)] *three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50)* nor more than [twenty-five (\$25)] *fifty dollars (\$50)*. Such license shall be kept posted conspicuously in or about the magazine for which issued. Licenses shall expire annually on the thirty-first day of December, and shall be renewed annually upon payment of the fee as specified in this section.

AN ACT

To further amend sections four, five and ten of the act, approved the second day of May, one thousand nine hundred twenty-nine (Pamphlet Laws 1518), entitled, as amended, "An act regulating the construction, equipment, maintenance, operation and inspection of elevators; granting certain authority to and imposing certain duties upon the Department of Labor and Industry; providing fees for inspection of elevators, certificates of operation, and approval of plans; providing penalties for *violations of this act; and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act," by increasing certain fees.
