Section 2. The sum of one hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Welfare for the purpose of surveying the need for the construction of diagnostic or treatment centers, hospitals for the chronically ill and impaired, rehabilitation facilities, and nursing homes, subject to the reimbursement of part thereof to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as provided by the Federal "Medical Facilities Survey and Construction Act of 1954."

AN ACT

Amending the act of January twenty-one, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 3), entitled "An act relating to officers and employes of the General Assembly; fixing the number, qualifications, compensation, mileage and duties of the officers and employes of the Senate and of the House of Representatives; providing for their election or appointment, term of office, or of service, removal, and manner of filling vacancies; and making appropriations to the Senate, House of Representatives and Legislative Reference Bureau," changing the compensation of certain officers and employes and making appropriations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section two, clauses (1), (1.1) and (2) of section three and sections seven, eight, twenty-two, twenty-five and twenty-six of the act of January twenty-one, one thousand nine hundred forty-seven (Pamphlet Laws 3), entitled "An act relating to officers and employes of the General Assembly; fixing the number, qualifications, compensation, mileage and duties of the officers and employes of the Senate and of the House of Representatives; providing for their election or appointment, term of office, or of service, removal, and manner of filling vacancies; and making appropriations to the Senate, House of Representatives and Legislative Refer-

ence Bureau," amended August twenty-one, one thousand nine hundred fifty-three (Pamphlet Laws 1262), are further amended to read:

President of Senate: officers and employes.

Section 2. The following officers and employes of the Senate shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) Two clerks to the President at an annual salary of three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3300) each;

(2) One secretary to the President at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(3) *One administrative assistant to the President at an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000);*

(4) *One President's page at a per diem compensation of ten dollars (\$10).*

President pro tempore: officers and employes.

Section 3. The following officers and employes of the Senate shall be appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One secretary to the President pro tempore at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(1.1) [One clerk] *Two clerks* to the President pro tempore at an annual salary of three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3300) *each*;

(1.2) *One administrative assistant to the President pro tempore at an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000);*

(2) One messenger to the President pro tempore at a per diem compensation of [eight dollars (\$8)] *ten dollars (\$10)*;

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Majority Leader of Senate: employes.

Section 7. The following employes of the Senate shall be appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate who, for the purpose of this act, shall be deemed an officer of the Senate, to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One secretary to the Majority Leader at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(2) One administrative assistant to the Majority Leader at [a per diem compensation of fifteen dollars (\$15)] *an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000)*;

(3) One [messenger] *legislative clerk* to the Majority Leader at a per diem compensation of [eight dollars (\$8)] *fifteen dollars (\$15)*.

Minority Leader of Senate: employes.

Section 8. The following employes of the Senate shall be appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate who, for the *purposes of this act, shall be deemed an

officer of the Senate, to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

(1) One secretary to the Minority Leader at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(2) One administrative assistant to the Minority Leader at [a per diem compensation of fifteen dollars (\$15)] *an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000)*;

(3) One [messenger] *legislative clerk* to the Minority Leader at a per diem compensation of [eight dollars (\$8)] *fifteen dollars (\$15)*.

Section 22. The following officers and employes of the House of Representatives shall be appointed by the Speaker to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

Speaker of House: officers and employes.

(1) One parliamentarian at an annual salary of seven thousand dollars (\$7000);

(2) One administrative assistant at an annual salary of [four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100)] *five thousand dollars (\$5000)*;

(3) One secretary at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(4) One Speaker's clerk at an annual salary of three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3300);

(5) *One Speaker's page at a per diem compensation of ten dollars (\$10)*.

Section 25. The following employes of the House of Representatives shall be appointed by the Majority Leader who, for the purposes of this act, shall be deemed an officer of the House of Representatives, to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

Majority Leader of House: employes.

(1) One secretary at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(2) One administrative assistant at [a per diem compensation of fifteen dollars (\$15)] *an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000)*;

(3) One [messenger] *legislative clerk* at a per diem compensation of [eight dollars (\$8)] *fifteen dollars (\$15)*.

Section 26. The following employes of the House of Representatives shall be appointed by the Minority Leader who, for the purposes of this act, shall be deemed an officer of the House of Representatives, to serve at his pleasure and receive the compensation and perform the duties herein specified:

Minority Leader of House: employes.

(1) One secretary at an annual salary of four thousand one hundred dollars (\$4100);

(2) One administrative assistant at [a per diem compensation of fifteen dollars (\$15)] *an annual salary of five thousand dollars (\$5000)*;

(3) One [messenger] *legislative clerk* at a per diem compensation of [eight dollars (\$8)] *fifteen dollars (\$15)*.

Appropriation.

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as is necessary, are appropriated to the Senate and to the House of Representatives for the legislative session of 1955. The sums appropriated hereby shall be in addition to any sums heretofore appropriated for the purposes.

(5) To the House of Representatives for the payment of contingent expenses including extra services of employes of the House of Representatives and clerical, stenographic, traveling, and discretionary charges of the Chairman of the Minority Caucus, the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000).

(6) To the Senate for the payment of salaries and per diem compensation provided for in this act, and for the payment of increases in salaries and per diem compensation provided for in this act, the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
