

Section 15. Severability.

If any provision hereof or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this act shall not be affected thereby.

Section 16. Time of Taking Effect.

This act shall be in force and take effect immediately after enactment, but shall not affect any suit, proceeding or appeal then pending.

Section 17. Repeal of Prior Acts.

The act approved the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred one (Pamphlet Laws 582), entitled "An act to provide for the registration of labels, trade-marks, trade-names, stamps, designs, devices, shop-marks, terms, brands, designations, descriptions, or forms of advertisement, and protect and secure the rights, property and interest therein of the persons, copartnerships or corporations adopting and filing the same, and providing penalties for the violations of the act," and its amendments, are hereby repealed.

All other acts relating to trade-marks and parts of any other acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed on the effective date of this act: Provided, That as to any suit, proceeding or appeal pending at the time this act shall take effect, such repeal shall not be deemed to be effective until final determination of said pending suit, proceeding or appeal.

AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to sell and convey 57.8 acres, more or less, of land situate in Hanover Township, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, with the approval of the Governor.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to sell, at public sale to the highest bidder, the following described tract of land situate in the Township of Hanover, County of Beaver and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a fallen dead oak replaced by a concrete monument in the east line of lands of the Commonwealth

Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, authorized to sell, at public sale, certain land in Hanover Township, Beaver County.

of Pennsylvania and on the north side of State Legislative Route 04054; thence by the lands of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania north 6 degrees 30 minutes 30 seconds east 2515.5 feet, more or less, to a concrete monument; thence by land now or formerly of Harry L. Burgun north 87 degrees 38 minutes 30 seconds east 821.5 feet, more or less, to a point in the line of lands now or formerly of Harry L. Burgun and Joseph W. Dunbar; thence by land now or formerly of Joseph W. Dunbar south 1 degree 25 minutes west 2875 feet, more or less, to a concrete monument on the north side of State Legislative Route 04054; thence north 71 degrees 49 minutes west 1089 feet, more or less, to a concrete monument the point and place of beginning, containing 57.8 acres of land, be the same more or less, and being a portion of the same premises conveyed by deed of Joseph W. Pschirer and Hilda Pschirer, his wife, et al., to Harry L. Burgun and Elizabeth M. Burgun, husband and wife, dated June 27, 1946, and recorded in Beaver County, Deed Book volume 550, at page 288, as well as being the same premises acquired by eminent domain proceedings commenced by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The conveyance shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies, as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estates or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Deed of conveyance to be approved by Department of Justice, and executed by Department of Property and Supplies.
Deposit of proceeds.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice, and shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 3. All *moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the General Fund.

Act effective immediately.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately upon final enactment.
