

include blank cartridges and toy cannons in which explosives are used, the type of balloons which require fire underneath to propel the same, firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrocketers, Roman candles, Daygo bombs, sparklers or other fireworks of like construction, and any fireworks containing any explosive or flammable compound or any tablets or other device containing an explosive substance.

The term "fireworks" shall not include toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns, or other devices in which paper caps containing twenty-five hundredths grains or less of explosive compound are used, providing they are so constructed that the hand cannot come in contact with the cap when in place for the explosion, and toy pistol paper caps which contain less than twenty hundredths grains of explosive mixture, the sale and use of which shall be permitted at all times, *nor shall the term "fireworks" include toy cannons which operate on the *principle of mixing calcium carbide, weighing less than one tenth of an ounce, and water in the reservoir of the cannon and in which ignition results upon the creation of a spark.*

The term "municipalities" shall include cities, boroughs, incorporated towns and townships.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Exceptions.

AN ACT

Amending the act of July 18, 1935 (P. L. 1314), entitled, as amended, "An act authorizing the utilization of the Pennsylvania State Police Training School for training persons to act as policemen in the political subdivisions of the Commonwealth; prescribing the qualifications for admission of such persons to such schools; providing for the payment of certain costs by such students; conferring certain powers upon the Pennsylvania State Police; and making an appropriation," changing the name of the Pennsylvania State Police Training School to the Pennsylvania State Police Academy.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Pennsylvania State Police Academy.

Section 1. The title and section 1, act of July 18, 1935 (P. L. 1314), entitled, as amended, "An act authorizing the utilization of the Pennsylvania State Police Training School for training persons to act as policemen in the political subdivisions of the Commonwealth; prescribing the qualifications for admission of such persons to such school; providing for the payment of certain costs by such students; conferring certain powers upon the Penn-

AN ACT

Title. Authorizing the utilization of the Pennsylvania State Police [Training School] *Academy* for training persons to act as policemen in the political subdivisions of the Commonwealth; prescribing the qualifications for admission of such persons to such school; providing for the payment of certain costs by such students; conferring certain powers upon the Pennsylvania State Police; and making *an appropriation.

Pennsylvania State Police.

Police of municipalities may be trained at Pennsylvania State Police Academy.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Pennsylvania State Police shall have the power, and its duty shall be, to conduct at the Pennsylvania State Police [Training School] *Academy* courses of instruction for the proper training of persons to act as policemen for the several political subdivisions of this Commonwealth. Subject to the provisions of this act, the Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police is hereby authorized to establish standards of proficiency, training and discipline for persons attending such school, and to issue certificates of qualification to graduates of the various courses of **instruction. The Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor, shall employ such instructors and other employes as may be necessary for the purposes of this act.

AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P. L. 177), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which
