

The jury commissioners shall each receive [seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50)] *twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)* for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties. The said compensation shall be paid from the county *treasury in the same manner as the salary or compensation of other county officers and employes.

The county auditors shall receive twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties, together with six cents (6¢) per mile circular from and to their homes, once, each and every day so employed.

Section 2. The act of May 12, 1887 (P. L. 95), entitled "An act regulating the compensation of county auditors within this Commonwealth," amended June 21, 1947 (P. L. 851), is repealed in so far as it applies to counties of the seventh class.

Specific repeals as to 7th class counties.

The act of June 28, 1955 (P. L. 206), entitled "An act fixing the compensation and mileage of county auditors in counties of the sixth, seventh and eighth classes," is repealed in so far as it applies to counties of the seventh class.

All acts and parts of acts, general, local and special, are repealed in so far as they are inconsistent herewith.

General repeal.

Section 3. This act shall become effective and applicable to all of the pertinent county officers who shall begin a term of office on or after the first Monday of January, 1960.

AN ACT

Amending the act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 971), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the eighth class," increasing the annual salaries of certain county officers in counties of the eighth class.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Eighth class counties.

Section 1. Section 1, act of June 25, 1947 (P. L. 971), entitled "An act relating to the annual salaries and compensation of certain county officers of counties of the eighth class," amended August 19, 1953 (P. L. 1176), is amended to read:

Salaries of
county officers.

Section 1. The annual salaries of the following county officers of counties of the eighth class shall be as follows:

(a) The sheriff, in counties having a population of less than twelve thousand (12,000), [two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200)] *three thousand four hundred dollars (\$3,400)*; and in counties having a population of twelve thousand (12,000) and more, but less than twenty thousand (20,000), [two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$2,800)] *three thousand nine hundred dollars (\$3,900)*.

(b) The county commissioners, in counties having a population of less than twelve thousand (12,000), [one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500)] *two thousand three hundred dollars (\$2,300)* each, and in counties having a population of twelve thousand (12,000) and more, [two thousand dollars (\$2,000)] *three thousand dollars (\$3,000)* each.

(c) The district attorney, in counties having a population of less than twelve thousand (12,000), [one thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200)] *two thousand four hundred dollars (\$2,400)*; and in counties having a population of twelve thousand (12,000) and more, [but less than twenty thousand (20,000), one thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,800)] *two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$2,800)*.

(d) The county auditors shall each receive ten dollars (\$10) for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties.

(e) The jury commissioners shall each receive [seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50)] *twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50)* for each day necessarily employed in the discharge of their duties. The said compensation shall be paid from the county treasury in the same manner as the salary or compensation of other county officers and employes.

General repeal.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts, general, local and special, are repealed in so far as they are inconsistent herewith.

Effective date.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall be applicable to all pertinent county officers who shall begin a term of office after the first Monday of January, 1960.
