

Law," when the borough is located within the area for which the agency has been authorized to make application to and receive grants from the Department of Commerce for the purposes specified in the "Industrial Development Assistance Law." Such appropriations by any borough shall not exceed, in any one year, ten cents (10¢) for each inhabitant of the borough.

Repealing the act of July 29, 1953 (P. L. 996), entitled, as amended, "An act creating an Anthracite Mine Drainage Study Commission for the purpose of making a study, investigation and legislative recommendations relating to the drainage of anthracite mines; authorizing the commission to act in an advisory capacity in the allocation of funds; and making an appropriation."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Repeal.

Section 1. The act of July 29, 1953 (P. L. 996), entitled, as amended, "An act creating an Anthracite Mine Drainage Study Commission for the purpose of making a study, investigation and legislative recommendations relating to the drainage of anthracite mines; authorizing the commission to act in an advisory capacity in the allocation of funds; and making an appropriation," reenacted and amended April 4, 1956 (P. L. 1389), is repealed.

Reenacting and amending the act of November 19, 1959 (P.
