AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P. L. 1206), entitled "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the law relating thereto," authorizing the establishment and maintenance of certain places used and maintained for the collection, storage and disposal of certain goods and materials to be licensed.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

The First Class Township Code.

Section 1. Clause XLIII. of section 1502, act of June 24, 1931 (P. L. 1206), known as "The First Class Township Code," reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P. L. 1955), is amended to read:

Clause XLIII., section 1502, act of June 24, 1931, P. L. 1206, reenacted and amended May 27, 1949, P. L. 1955, further amended.

Section 1502. The corporate power of a township of the first class shall be vested in the board of township commissioners. The board shall have power:

\* \* \* \* \*

XLIII. Junk Dealers, Pawnbrokers, Auctions. To regulate and license junk dealers, pawnbrokers, hucksters, peddlers, vendors, and public auctions and auctioneers and to regulate *and license* the establishment and maintenance of junk yards, salvage yards and other places used and maintained for the collection, storage and disposal of used and second-hand goods and materials.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
