AN ACT

Amending the act of March 2, 1956 (P. L. 1211), entitled "An act providing for and regulating the licensing and practice of practical nursing; imposing duties on the State Board of Nurse Examiners; and imposing penalties," providing for biennial licenses.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of *Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Practical Nurse Law.

Section 1. Sections 12 and 13, act of March 2, 1956 (P. L. 1211), known as the "Practical Nurse Law," are amended to read:

Sections 12 and 13, act of March 2, 1956, P. L. 1211, amended.

Section 12. Each original license issued and recorded under the provisions of this act shall authorize the holder to practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse from the date of the issuance of said license until the last day of June [next succeeding] *of the year the license was issued if it was issued prior to the last day of June in an even-numbered year and until the last day of June in the next succeeding year if it was issued after the last day of June in an even-numbered year or in an odd-numbered year*, unless said license shall be revoked or suspended for cause as hereinafter provided.

Time limit of license.

Section 13. Every licensed practical nurse receiving a license under the provisions of this act shall [annually], during the month of June *of 1962 and biennially thereafter*, apply for renewal of such license, whereupon the board shall upon the payment of the fee of [one dollar (\$1.00)] *two dollars (\$2.00)* issue a renewal of said license for the term of one year and such renewal shall be duly recorded as hereinbefore provided.

Renewal.
