

Section 3. The Secretary of the Commonwealth, the courts of common pleas and prothonotaries shall not approve any corporate name or register any assumed or fictitious name including the words "college" or "university" used in such a way as to give the impression that it is an educational institution conforming to the standards and qualifications prescribed by the State [Council] Board of Education, unless the application for incorporation or change of name or the application for registration is accompanied by a certificate from the Department of Public Instruction that the corporation or proposed corporation or the person or persons applying for registration is entitled to use such designation.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

Repealing the act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 751), entitled "An act providing for granting State aid to school districts of the third and fourth class, for the purpose of assisting in rebuilding destroyed school buildings, or securing sites, or consolidating and constructing school buildings in third or fourth class districts; and establishing a fund in the State Treasury for such purposes, to be known as the School Building Aid Fund."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

School districts of third and fourth class.

Section 1. The act of May 4, 1927 (P. L. 751), entitled "An act providing for granting State aid to school districts of the third and fourth class, for the purpose of assisting in rebuilding destroyed school buildings, or securing sites, or consolidating and constructing school buildings in third or fourth class districts; and establishing a fund in the State Treasury for such purposes, to be known as the School Building Aid Fund," is repealed.

Act of May 4, 1927, P. L. 751, repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
