The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized on behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to sell, at public sale, to the highest bidder the following described tract of land situate in the Township of North Woodbury, County of Blair, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a stake at the southeast point of land now or late of Charles H. Ake and Bertha M. Ake, his wife, thence north 36 degrees 45 minutes east, for a distance of 600 feet to a point or stake; thence north 72 degrees 25 minutes west, for a distance of 775 feet to a point or stake; thence south 19 degrees 35 minutes for a distance of 600 feet to a point or stake; thence south 75 degrees 34 minutes east for a distance of 600 feet to the point or place of beginning; containing 9.158 acres of land, more or less, as per survey made by George Burley, surveyor, under date of August 10, 1936.

Being the same premises acquired by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania through eminent domain proceedings entered to No. 240, March Term, 1937, in the Court of Common Pleas of Blair County, Pennsylvania, against Charles H. Ake and Bertha M. Ake, his wife.

The conveyance shall be made under and subject, nevertheless, to all easements, servitudes and rights of others, including but not confined to streets, roadways and rights of any telephone, telegraph, water, electric, gas or pipe line companies as well as under and subject, nevertheless, to any estates or tenancies vested in third persons, whether or not appearing of record, for any portion of the said land or improvements erected thereon.

Section 2. The deed of conveyance shall be approved by the Department of Justice, shall be executed by the Secretary of Property and Supplies in the name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Section 3. All moneys received from the sale of the land herein authorized to be conveyed shall be deposited in the Motor License Fund.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 230

Amending the act of May 28, 1937 (P. L. 1019), entitled "An act relating to statutory laws; prescribing an enacting clause for statutes; fixing the effective date and time of statutes hereafter enacted; providing for notice of application for local and special legislation, for the correction of errors in statutes, and for the printing and publication of statutes; prescribing rules for the interpretation of statutes; defining

certain words and phrases when used in statutes; and prescribing rules for the construction and operation of amendments, re-enactments and repeal of statutes," changing the provisions relating to the effective date of certain laws.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 4 of the act of May 28, 1937 (P. L. 1019), known as the "Statutory Construction Act," amended January 9, 1960 (P. L. 2149), is amended to read:

Section 4. Effective Date and Time of Laws.—All laws hereafter enacted finally at a regular session of the Legislature, except laws making appropriations, and except laws affecting the budget of any political subdivision, shall be in full force and effect from and after the first day of September next following their final enactment, unless a different date is specified in the law itself, or if enacted finally after the first day of July of the year of the regular session, or after the date specified in the law, the same shall become effective sixty days after final enactment.

Appropriations, laws, or laws having appropriation items, enacted finally at a regular session of the Legislature, shall be in full force and effect from and after the first day of [June] July next following

their final enactment, unless a different date is specified in the law itself, or unless any such appropriation law or law having an appropriation item is enacted finally after the first day of [June] July in any

year, in which case it shall be in full force and effect immediately upon final enactment.

Laws affecting the budget of any political subdivision, enacted finally at a regular session of the Legislature, shall be in full force and effect at the beginning of the fiscal year of the political subdivisions affected following the date of the final enactment of such law unless a different date is specified in the law itself.

All laws enacted finally at a special or extraordinary session of the Legislature, shall be in full force and effect sixty days after final enactment, unless a different date is specified in the law itself.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 272

Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P. L. 1206), entitled "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," increasing the per diem payments and traveling allowance of delegates to conventions of county associations of township officers.
