Amending the act of June 17, 1913 (P. L. 507), entitled "An act to provide revenue for State and county purposes, and, in cities coextensive with counties, for city and county purposes; imposing taxes upon certain classes of personal property; providing for the assessment and collection of the same; providing for the duties and compensation of prothonotaries and recorders in connection therewith; and modifying existing legislation which provided for raising revenue for State purposes," designating certain fees to be included in claims for taxes presented at the audit of any estate in the orphans' court.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 16, act of June 17, 1913 (P. L. 507), entitled "An act to provide revenue for State and county purposes, and, in cities coextensive with counties, for city and county purposes; imposing taxes upon certain classes of personal property; providing for the assessment and collection of the same; providing for the duties and compensation of prothonotaries and recorders in connection therewith; and modifying existing legislation which provided for raising revenue for State purposes," amended July 3, 1947 (P. L. 1249), is amended to read:

Section 16. * * *

(c) Claims for taxes due under this act may be collected by action in assumpsit brought by the county against the taxpayer, or may be presented at the audit of any estate in the orphans' court. Such claims

presented at the audit of any estate in the orphans' court shall include the satisfaction fees for any tax imposed pursuant to this act which has been entered and docketed in the "Personal Property Tax Lien Docket," and upon payment of the claim, the docket shall be cleared.

Amending the act of September 9, 1965 (P. L. 498), entitled "An act exempting certain firemen, policemen and volunteer ambulance and rescue squad personnel from civil liability when rendering emergency care, first aid and rescue in the performance of their official duties except in certain instances," extending the provisions of the act.
