AN ACT

SB 1553

Amending the act of June 13, 1907 (P. L. 621), entitled "An act authorizing and directing the Secretary of Internal Affairs to compile and publish connected warrantee tract maps of each of the several counties of this Commonwealth;

making an appropriation for the work of compilation, and directing the manner of sale and distribution of the same," transferring the duties of the Secretary of Internal Affairs to the Secretary of Community Affairs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title, act of June 13, 1907 (P. L. 621), entitled "An act authorizing and directing the Secretary of Internal Affairs to compile and publish connected warrantee tract maps of each of the several counties of this Commonwealth; making an appropriation for the work of compilation, and directing the manner of sale and distribution of the same," is amended to read:

AN ACT

Authorizing and directing the Secretary of [Internal] Community

Affairs to compile and publish connected warrantee tract maps of each of the several counties of this Commonwealth; making an appropriation for the work of compilation, and directing the manner of sale and distribution of the same.

Section 2. Sections 1 and 3 of the act, amended March 30, 1921 (P. L. 63), are amended to read:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Secretary of [Internal] Community Affairs shall compile, or cause to be compiled, connected warrantee tract maps of each of the several counties of this Commonwealth, from the records on file in the Department of [Internal] Community Affairs, showing the outlines of the original surveys, names of warrantees, dates of warrants, dates of surveys, names of patentees, dates of patents, together with such other important details as may appear on the original drafts; also county, township, city, and borough lines, where the necessary data can be conveniently obtained from official or reliable sources; said maps to be drawn on a scale or scales as nearly uniform as may be practicable, in order to clearly show the details of each of the several surveys embraced in any one county. Copies of original or special drafts, showing historical or topographical features of interest and value in connection with original grants and surveys, may also be included, together with such textual matter as the Secretary of [Internal] Community Affairs may deem necessary to a proper elucidation of the subject. The Secretary of [Internal] Community Affairs shall make an atlas of such warrantee tract maps of each county, upon tracing linen, for permanent file in his office, and shall furnish a free blue print copy to the county commissioners and to the recorder of deeds of the county, and he shall sell, to all persons desiring the same, blue print copies at a price to be by him fixed.

Section 3. The unsold copies of atlases heretofore published under the authority of this act shall be distributed at the discretion of the Secretary of [Internal] Community Affairs.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 1554

Amending the act of July 9, 1959 (P. L. 510), entitled "An act relating to the public lands of the Commonwealth; defining such land; providing for the sale of vacant and unimproved public lands and the price to be paid therefor; providing for the conveyance of title to vacant and unappropriated public land to the Department of Forests and Waters for forest culture, forest reservation, or State park purposes; providing for the conveyance of title to all public lands for which applications have been made or warrants issued and to all persons having rights by settlement and improvement upon payment of the purchase price; providing for the release of liens for unpaid purchase price in certain cases; preventing the granting of title to lands and islands in the bed of navigable rivers and streams declared by law to be public highways except in certain cases; and prescribing the duties of the Department of Internal Affairs with respect to the administration of the public lands and the records thereof, including surveys of county and Commonwealth boundaries and documents having to do with early titles," transferring functions of the Department of Internal Affairs to the Department of Community Affairs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The title, clauses (e) and (g) of section 2, and clause (4) of section 11, act of July 9, 1959 (P. L. 510), known as the "Pennsylvania Public Lands Act," are amended to read:
