HB 1034

Limiting the rates at which certain entities other than public utilities may resell public utility service to residential consumers; and providing penalties.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Whenever any person, corporation or other entity, not a public utility, electric cooperative corporation, municipality authority or municipal corporation, purchases service from a public utility and resells it to consumers, the bill rendered by the reseller to any residential consumer shall not exceed the amount which the public utility would bill its own residential consumers for the same quantity of service under the residential rate of its tariff then currently in effect.

Section 2. Any person, corporation or other entity violating the provisions of this act shall, upon summary conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100) multiplied by the number of residential bills exceeding the maximum prescribed in section 1.

Section 3. This act shall take effect sixty days after its enactment.
