Amending the act of April 4, 1905 (P.L.102), entitled "An act to provide for the better protection of life and property, by the examination and licensing of engineers having charge of steam-boilers, steam-engines, and appliances connected therewith, in cities of the second and third class of this Commonwealth, and providing penalties for violation," reducing certain age requirements.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 1, act of April 4, 1905 (P.L.102), entitled "An act to provide for the better protection of life and property, by the examination and licensing of engineers having charge of steam-boilers, steam-engines, and appliances connected therewith, in cities of the second and third class of this Commonwealth, and providing penalties for violation," is amended to read:

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to have charge of or to operate a steam-boiler or steam-engine over ten-horsepower, in cities of the second and third class of this Commonwealth, except locomotive boilers, used in transportation, and steam-engines and steam-boilers, carrying less than fifteen pounds pressure per square inch, unless said person or persons are upwards of **[twenty-one] *eighteen*** years of age, and holds a license, as hereinafter provided for; and it shall be unlawful for any owner or owners, user or users, of any steam-boiler or steam-engine over ten-horsepower, other than those excepted above, to operate or cause to be operated a steam-boiler or steam-engine without a duly licensed engineer.
